The Studio

Taliesin has launched a four year community-wide design and re-proposing project. Globe and Miami are rural mining towns located ninety miles east of Taliesin West in Arizona and have a deep historical roots in the formation of the state. In fact, Globe was originally intended to be the capitol of Arizona and produced the state's first governor and first female governor.

Issue areas of focus:

- Economic strains.
- Younger generation tends to leave the community.
- Population aging due to the departure of millennials.

Studio Strategy:

- Beautification of existing structures and surfaces.
- Re-purposing of significant buildings and spaces.
- Community engagement and local participation.



Public Presentations & Town Halls

Over the past six months the School has conducted over fifty public presentations, community meetings and town halls in the area. The School was also able to create a local Advisory Committee comprised of local stakeholders to help navigate the two towns as well as identify tangible priorities.



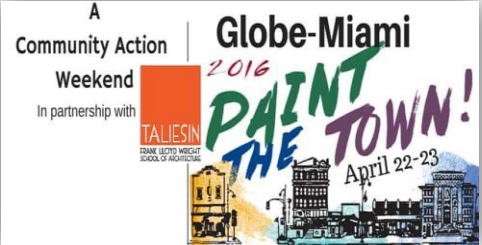
Public Exhibitions
